CHAIR AN'S REPORT, BY RICK RIGG, OUTGOING CHAIRMAN

Well, we've managed to survive another year of organizing the Anarchy in NV caving. There have been some notable accomplishments:

1. The MV Region -- Though many years in the talking stage, the NW region today is reality. With the agreements that grew out of the Memorial Day Papoose Cave meeting, the various widely separated grottos were able to agree on goal and the region was formed. Chas. Amasyst

2. The Papoose Cave meeting -- Through Bob Brown's organizing efforts, we were able to gather cavers from 5 states and check much cave country. A rescue practice and the social atmosphere that developed foretell good Folthings for caving cooperation in the Northwest. Language (Concay)
