FIELD TRIP REPORT: PARADISE ICE CAVES

On Moon Monday, Charley Anderson and I had a look at the Paradise Ice Caves system. The Water Passage was still snowed shut. A ferocious blast of chill air was emerging from a narrow tunnel leading into the Pillar Passage; the orifice of the Big Room section was larger. The Great Pillar was largely shrouded by snow. A larval grylloblattid was found on the wall opposite the Pillar. Charley discovered a creveway leading off a very pretty domed side-chamber off the Big Room that looked as if it was going to lead to the Pillar Passage, but did not; it trifurcated at a point which must be close to the headwall.

Plenty of tourists showed up by mid-afternoon, mostly amused by our cloud-white. Worth a few snickers, though; not a trace of sunburn.
